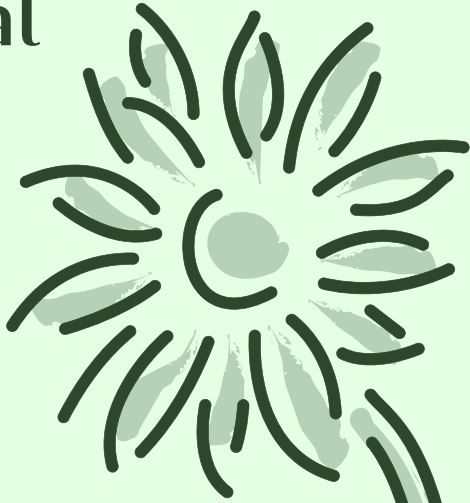

Awards for Flower Show Participants:

A first, second and third place ribbon will be awarded in each of the listed categories. Multiple ribbons may be given in any category at the discretion of the judges. A special Best of Show ribbon is also presented. Participation ribbons are given to each entry in the exhibit.

Judging is based on but not limited to the following:

Visual appeal, quality and originality of exhibit.

Flower Show Competition Information & Categories

In an effort to promote fair competition, listed categories may be subdivided into the following categories:

Self-Grown: All plant material in your display grown and arranged by exhibitor; no commercially bought plants or flowers may be used.

Not Self-Grown: Any commercially produced material or combination of commercial and self-grown material is allowed. The display must be arranged by exhibitor.

A. Cut flowers: Includes wild or cultivated, house or garden variety.

B. Potted Plants:

1. Foliage
2. Flowering
3. Cactus and Succulent
4. Bonsai
5. Terrarium and Dish Garden

C. Orchids: Includes plants, single blooms or arrangements.

D. Roses:

1. single bloom
2. multi bloom on a single stem
3. cut rose arrangement.

E. Children: A special group of categories for children up to and including age 13. Entry must relate to flowers or plants in some way.

F. Dried flowers: Arrangements must be the work of the entrant.

G. Silk flowers: Arrangements must be the work of the entrant.

H. Table Arrangements: All linen, silverware, tableware and accessories for a service for two is to be included in the exhibit. Space allowed is 30" by 36". Judging is based on overall appeal including a required floral presentation.

I. Creative Theme: Entries are judged on combined use of live or artificial flowers and objects relating to a specific theme.

J. Commercial: This is an open class for florists, landscapers, companies and professional individuals. Promotional signs are limited to 3" by 12". Judging is based on creativity, effort and over all horticultural design.

Flower Show Entry Rules

1. Any number of entries are permitted that are different in design, variety, color or culture.
2. Exhibitors must place their entries by 8:30am on Saturday morning August 7th, 2004. Facilities will be open for setting up at 7:30am, Saturday morning. Judging will take place Saturday morning between 8:30am and 9:30am. Late entries will not be included in judging.
3. Entrants must register upon entering facility; the Club will supply a registration card on which entrants must fill in information necessary for placement in the proper category. The card will be placed in front of the display and remain folded appropriately to conceal the entrants name until after the judging.
4. Containers must be waterproof and appropriate for display.
5. Exhibitors assume responsibility for maintaining all arrangements and assume all responsibility for materials in their exhibits. Entries may be removed after 5:30pm but Must be removed before 7pm Saturday evening.
6. Committee has final say on locations, changes or removal of exhibits. Please Note Changes In Category Requirements. White table coverings will be supplied by the organization committee.
